## Pottsville Environment Park walking track repair works

Two key walking tracks in Pottsville Environment Park will undergo repair works and upgrades in early 2026.

Timber footbridges and boardwalks along the Melaleuca and Eucalyptus tracks, originally built in the 1980s, will be replaced with new materials better suited to withstand the park's environmental conditions.

Once completed, this will provide an improved visitor experience.

<b>Location</b>	<b>Pottsville Environment Park, Pottsville</b>
<b>Schedule of works</b>	Starts February 2026 for about 4 months, weather permitting.
<b>Work hours</b>	Monday to Friday, 7 am to 5 pm Works may need to be conducted some Saturdays, between 7 am to 1 pm.
<b>Alternative routes</b>	During construction, a section of the Melaleuca Track and the eastern part of the Eucalyptus Track will be closed. All other park areas will remain open.

### What to expect

- Certain areas within Pottsville Environment Park will be barricaded off, preventing public access.
- Site fencing will be erected around the construction site.
- Pedestrians can use alternative walkways in the park, unless directed otherwise.
- No pedestrian access through the work site.
- Small machinery.
- Stockpiles of building materials, and building materials being transported through the park.
- Some construction noise and dust.
- Minor ground vibrations.

The works will include:

- removing old timber footbridges and boardwalks
- construction of new composite fibre footbridges and boardwalks according to environmental approvals

We'll inform you beforehand if there will be any major changes or additional inconvenience. Thank you for your understanding and patience as we complete these essential works.
