

### **Weekly Summary (9–16 December 2025)**

Between 9 and 16 December 2025, police took legal action against **55 individuals** for **98 offences**. Of these, **67 offences were non-domestic related**, while **19 individuals were charged with 31 domestic violence-related offences**. The most common offences included breaches of AVOs, assaults (including DV-related), drug possession, stalking and intimidation, property damage, theft, and a range of traffic offences such as drink driving, driving while disqualified, and unlicensed driving.

#### **Significant arrests and court outcomes included:**

- A **41-year-old man from Myocum** was arrested on 16 December in relation to multiple serious domestic violence, property, and traffic offences. He was refused bail and remains in custody, due to reappear at **Tweed Heads Local Court on 22 December 2025**.
- A **35-year-old man from Uriup** was arrested on 14 December after being found in a stolen Toyota LandCruiser, with methylamphetamine also located. He will appear at **Tweed Heads Local Court in early 2026**.
- A **34-year-old man** was arrested on 11 December on an outstanding warrant. Police allegedly located drugs and replica firearms following a search. He was refused bail and is due to appear in court in **February 2026**.
- A **19-year-old man from Nimbin** was convicted on 18 December of multiple take-and-drive offences and sentenced to **1 year and 8 months imprisonment**.

Tweed Byron Police also acknowledged strong community support following the recent Bondi terrorism incident, expressing condolences to affected families and support for injured colleagues. Police reaffirmed their commitment to community safety during the holiday period and wished the community a **safe and happy Christmas**, noting weekly updates will resume in **2026**.
